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- And finally, Death With Indignity is brought to us this week by *Bailey v. City of Leeds*, in which the court listed the items removed from a graveyard by city employees thusly, “concrete or ceramic angels, statues, or planters placed on a headstone or near a headstone or footstone; glass or transparent angels or crosses that illuminated and were hung from “sticks”; “shepherd’s hooks” on which were hung items such as birdhouses, baskets containing silk flowers, or wind chimes; and small vases, either freestanding or that had been placed on a headstone.” Not exactly Arlington National, eh? Cedar Grove Cemetery, where good taste goes to die.
